

For the 14th installment of ABC's *The Bachelorette* (returning Monday, May 28), recently scorned beauty Rebecca "Becca" Kufrin is getting a second chance at love. Kufrin was a participant on Season 22 of *The Bachelor*, and in the March 5 finale, the 27-year-old publicist from Minnesota was given the final rose — and was proposed to — by Arie Luyendyk Jr. But in a twist of reality TV, Luyendyk later changed his mind, broke off the relationship with Kufrin and, during the live broadcast of the franchise's postseason reunion show, proposed to runner-up Lauren Burnham. "It's like a soap opera," Kufrin admitted when she stopped by *The Ellen DeGeneres Show.* 

But now, instead of being one of 29 ladies struggling for the attention of a former racecar driver turned real estate agent, Becca will be in the driver's seat and have over two dozen men vying for her affection. "I don't really have a 'type," she revealed to DeGeneres. "I'm all over the board. But personality-wise, I want somebody who's honest and loyal — obviously." And if she's on a sincere search for lasting love, Kufrin's odds of success are much better on The Bachelorette, where six of the 13 couples formed are still together, while only one of the 21 couples formed on The Bachelor has resulted in a wedding (it's still too early to tell about Luyendyk and Burnham).

# They're Back, Baby!: **Recently Renewed Shows**

ABC has picked up several of its hit alternative series for new seasons: America's Funniest Home Videos (returning for Season 29), The Bachelor (Season 23), Dancing With the Stars (Season 27) and Child Support (Season 2). ... On the scripted front, ABC is bringing back the No. 1 new drama The Good Doctor for a second season. ... NBC's Will & Grace revival has been given an 18-episode third season order, even as its upcoming second season has been upped from 13 to 18 episodes. ... Also at NBC, Season 6 of *Hollywood Game Night* has been greenlit. ... *Drunk History* will return for another swig with a sixth season on Comedy Central. ... More plastic surgeries gone wrong will be covered in Season 5 of the E! series Botched. ... Pop has upped Schitt's Creek — its acclaimed, Eugene Levy-led comedy — for a fifth season to debut in 2019. ... Jessica Biel's USA Network drama The Sinner will return with Season 2 in summer 2018.

Remember these guys? In 2010 American Chopper, featuring custom motorcycle creators Paul Teutul Sr. and Paul Jr., went off the air. This month Discovery welcomes back the infamous father and

son.



# Discovery's Reality Hit "American Chopper" Is Back — Will Paul Teutul Sr. And Jr. Mend Their Frayed Relationship? By Jeff Pfeiffer

hat sounds almost funny, 'the return of American Chopper," says Paul Teutul Sr. modestly, and maybe a bit incredulously, early in our interview, when I begin asking him about bringing back his iconic bike-building reality series to Discovery Channel. He laughingly adds: "It's like, [dramatic voice] DUN-DUN-DUN.'

But it is rather dramatic, if also unsurprising, that the show would grace the airwaves again after leaving at the height of its popularity and ratings prowess in 2010. "It's the biggest question," Paul Sr. explains, talking about how fans and customers to his Orange County Choppers would often wonder if he, sons Paul Jr. and Mikey, and the rest of the famed group of American Chopper characters would return to TV.

Now that it is back, it doesn't sound like they will be messing too much with success, from what Paul Sr. and Paul Jr. (whom I also interviewed. separately) told me. American Chopper will again follow the Teutuls as they build customized bikes (although this time each with his own team), often for A-list celebs and Forbes 100 clients.

It's in American Chopper's family dynamic that viewers might notice some differences from when they last tuned

in. Fans surely recall the falling-out that led to a long and bitter estrangement between Paul Sr. and Jr. Things were so bad that Paul Sr. did not even attend his son's wedding and was not there for the birth of Paul Jr.'s son.

Along with starting his own family, Paul Jr. also has his own business, Paul Jr. Designs, which will feature in the series' return along with his father's famed Orange County Choppers. The latter company has seen changes, as well - OCC has expanded into a complex complete with a shop, café, bowling alley, restaurant and showroom.

An American Chopper "catch-up" special that Discovery aired in early March showed that this frayed relationship was, finally, at least beginning to mend, and along with the cool bike-building, the efforts made by father and son to come together - albeit reluctantly, at times - look to be a big theme in the show's return season.

"I don't see it ever being like it was before," Paul Sr. admitted, though he also said that he thinks "the relationship is the best it's ever been, and hopefully we'll grow on that."

Paul Jr. explained that "the crossover between me and my father will continue in good measure" as the series progresses. "It's a genuine desire for a relationship, I think on both of our sides. ... I will say this: All the stuff that's happening between us, both good and bad, we're covering all of it for the show. ... We're in this process of what I hope to be reconciliation, and I think my father wants that, too. [But] getting there can be challenging."

Perhaps not as challenging as it might have been had the two continued working in the same shop. As we see Paul Jr. working more with his father, versus for him - and now with a family of his own (Paul Jr. says his 3-year-old son Hudson is "the star of everything in my life now") - it seems like the two men might be starting to see a little more eye-to-eye.

"I know that we can't be in business together," Paul Sr. admitted. "That would ruin our relationship. ... We're doing personal things [in the new series]. We're working on personal bikes together. It's not business-related, so that will also help the relationship grow."

For a show that Paul Sr. boasts was "the first real reality show," it sounds like American Chopper is going to indeed continue keeping it very real.

# Lesley Manville Headlines A New Season Of The **BBC Hit.** By Jeff Pfeiffer

When we interviewed acclaimed British actress Lesley Manville in early 2017 about her series Harlots, which was airing in the States on the Hulu streaming service, she also touched on other upcoming projects on which she was working.

"I'm about to start with Paul Thomas Anderson and Daniel Day-Lewis on a film," Manville told us of a project about which she really was not able to reveal much. That movie ended up being, of course, the critically lauded Phantom Thread, for which Manville recently received a Best Supporting Actress Oscar nomination.

And Manville also told us last year that she was going "to do the second series of Mum, which is my series at the BBC. ... I play the 'mum' of the title, and [the character is] thoroughly good and nice and understanding and compassionate and nonjudgmental. She's just so lovely, this woman, so lovely."

Mum may not yet be as known to American audiences as Phantom Thread, but it should be, and U.S. audiences will have a chance to watch the comedy's second season when it airs here on BritBox (it recently completed its U.K. broadcast).

Manville's "mum" character (who actually does have a name: Cathy) is as nice and lovely as Manville describes - perhaps too much so at times, and that's part of what leads to the hilariously uncomfortable situations, misunderstandings and cringeworthy comedy.

"Generally, [people] say they love [the series] because they feel as if Cathy is, like, feeling what the audience is feeling watching it," Manville said at a recent press conference, "that she's this kind of steady center in the whole story, and that she's observing these slightly ridiculous characters around her, and, therefore, she's the sort of eyes of the audience."

Aside from it featuring Cathy as being a calm eye of the comedic storm swirling around her, the series is also guite touching.

"It's optimistic," Manville said, "because, at the end of the day, it is about seizing life, isn't it?"

Actor William Zabka is still best remembered among a certain generation thanks to his frequent portrayals of bullies and other assorted jerks in a number of '80s movie favorites. And that typecasting began with Zabka's most famous role as such a thug - Johnny Lawrence in the 1984 classic The Karate Kid.

Zabka's Johnny was a brutal bully to Ralph Macchio's new kid in town Daniel LaRusso, with their encounters culminating in the finals of a karate tournament. which Daniel won.

Flash-forward 34 years, and YouTube Red's new series Cobra Kai picks up with the lives of Johnny and Daniel as adults, Daniel (Macchio, reprising his role) now leads an enviable life with a beautiful family while running a successful string of local car dealerships.

Meanwhile, Johnny's (Zabka, also returning to costar and co-executive produce with Macchio) life has taken a rocky turn. He seeks redemption by reopening the infamous Cobra Kai karate dojo. When Daniel and Johnny's lives inevitably become intertwined again, their rivalry is reignited.

# ALL THINGS MUST PASS

Nothing lasts forever, and that's especially true of TV shows. These five series have had their seasons in the sun, and they'll sign off for good this spring. By Ryan A. Berenz



## The Americans

FX (2013)

Like many shows on FX, Cold War spy thriller *The Americans* wasn't a huge ratings hit, but it made up for that shortcoming with almost universal critical praise. Showrunners Joe Weisberg and Joel Fields knew long ago how they wanted the saga of Russian spies Philip (Matthew Rhys) and Elizabeth (Keri Russell) to end, and viewers who've followed them through every cloak-and-dagger moment will no doubt be rewarded (and surprised) when the series signs off on May 30. "It feels really good and satisfying what Joe and Joel have created," Russell said of the finale.

# The Middle ABC (2009)

The Middle is probably the best show that you forgot was still on TV. After nine seasons on ABC, the blue-collar comic adventures of the middle-class Heck family conclude May 22. In true Midwestern form, the series was a consistently solid performer, and it will go out on its own terms and at the top of its game. As creators Eileen Heisler and DeAnn Heline said, "We wanted to go out before too many people knew we were on the air."



# New Girl FOX (2011)

New Girl arrived on FOX as a wide-eyed, fresh and funny comedy centered on charmingly quirky Jess (Zooey Deschanel) and her male roommates. It thrived on Friends-style romantic tension, which it broke much too early in the series' run, and everyone involved seemed to have outgrown the show by Season 3. New Girl got an extended lease on life last year when FOX granted it a shortened final season, which featured a time jump ahead to the characters doing their best at adulting. New Girl will go out with a one-hour finale on May 15, but we hope the True American drinking game will live forever.

# The Fosters Freeform (2013)

Since it bowed on ABC Family in 2013, The Fosters has been a champion of inclusiveness and an inspiration to people in nontraditional families. Writerproducers Joanna Johnson, Bradley Bredeweg and Peter Paige said in a statement, "It's been the privilege of our lives to get to shepherd this beautiful family through five seasons of love, laughter, heartbreak, tribulation and triumph - and message to the world that DNA doesn't make a family, love does." The Fosters will wrap up with a three-night event June 4-6 on Freeform, though consider it not "goodbye" but "see you later." Freeform announced Callie (Maia Mitchell) and Mariana (Cierra Ramirez) will be the center of a spinoff series.

# Once Upon a Time ABC (2011)

Storybrooke's story comes to a close in a two-hour finale on May 18. There's been a lot of turnover in the principal cast, and Season 7 ratings suffered. But longtime favorites Snow White (Ginnifer Goodwin), Prince Charming (Josh Dallas), Emma Swan (Jennifer Morrison) and Belle French (Emilie de Ravin) will return for the finale. Creators Edward Kitsis and Adam Horowitz said in a statement, "We couldn't think of a more fitting way to say farewell than by reuniting so many of the characters that our fiercely loyal fans spent years with on their adventures. We hope everyone joins our Once family, old and new, for what we hope will be the sendoff of a lifetime befitting this stellar cast and its incomparable fans."

# All Eyes Are Watching As Harry And Meghan Say, "I Do." By Kellie Freeze

On Saturday, May 19, the eyes of the world will be on Windsor Castle for the wedding between Britain's Prince Harry, 33, and American actress Meghan Markle, 36. The castle's St. George's Chapel has been home to numerous royal events, including Harry's 1984 baptism, and is also where Prince Charles held a service of "prayer and dedication" after his 2005 civil ceremony to Camilla Parker Bowles. "It is a very special place for Prince Harry," says a statement released by Harry's communications secretary, explaining why the couple has decided to marry in the more intimate 800-seat chapel over larger venues

> like St. Paul's Cathedral or Westminster Abbey. The statement also shares that the wedding "will be a moment of fun and joy to reflect the characters and values of the bride and groom." Royal watchers

can't wait to see what personal touches the hands-on couple put into their big day.

Harry and Meghan have invited 2,640 members of the public onto the castle grounds to share in their wedding day and get a close look at the couple as they enter and exit St. George's. Twelve hundred of the lucky folks will be members of the public who "have shown strong leadership, and those who have served their communities," says a Kensington Palace spokesperson. The invitees also include 530 members of staff from the Royal Household and Crown Estate, 610 people from the local community, 200 people from charities supported by Harry and Meghan, and 100 local schoolchildren. In addition, thousands of adoring well-wishers are expected to line the parade route between the chapel and the castle.

Harry and Meghan's wedding event is expected to be a star-studded affair, as both bride and groom have lots of celebrity pals. The wedding will be followed by two receptions, the first of which will be held in St. George's Hall shortly after the ceremony for the couple and the wedding congregation. The second event will be a very intimate evening affair with only the couple's families and closest friends in attendance.

# WHAT'S IN A NAME?

British royal names are notoriously tricky to figure out, and Harry's is certainly no exception. His official name is "Henry Charles Albert David" and his current title is "His

Royal Highness Prince Henry of Wales." The descendants of Queen Elizabeth and Prince Philip carry their joint surname

"Mountbatten-Windsor," but while in school and during his military service, Harry used the last name "Wales." Markle's given name is Rachel, but she's long gone by her middle name, and after marriage, she will no longer have an official last name and will simply sign her name as "Meghan." The gueen is expected to bestow a royal title on the newlywed couple, with some people speculating that Harry and Meghan will postnuptially be known as "the Duke and Duchess of Sussex."

# **BLING ABOUT** THE RING

When he proposed to Markle, Prince Harry designed a custom ring filled with meaning. The bauble, made by court jewelers Cleave and Company, is set in yellow gold and uses a center stone from Botswana - where the young couple vacationed in August 2017 - and two very special side stones. Harry revealed, "The little diamonds on either side are from my mother's jewelry collection, to make sure that she's with us on this crazy journey together." Meghan's wedding band will be made of Welsh gold - a royal tradition since 1923.


Getting ready to play Markle has been a whirlwind for Fitz-Henley, who admits, "We didn't have a lot of time; everything was so fast." In addition to watching interviews and videos of Markle and straightening her naturally curly hair, Fitz-Henley shares, "I actually took some Pilates classes at a place where she used to take Pilates, just to walk in her shoes a little bit."

Prepping for the role also meant learning a few royal rules. "There are so many protocols to be followed by royals," says Fitz-Henley, who learned the proper way to curtsy and how to address the gueen. "You call her 'Your Majesty' once, and then after that you call her 'Ma'am.' It's Ma'am that rhymes with ham," she explains. And after getting a taste of Harry and Meghan's royal life, she says, "Being a royal is a job in and of itself, and it takes work."

Playing one of the world's most fashionable women has been a lot of fun, too. Fitz-Henley tells that her wardrobe for the film includes some of Markle's most iconic outfits. "Meghan's got some great taste," she marvels. And Fitz-Henley admits that once she had donned Meghan-esque hair and makeup, even she found their resemblance uncanny. "There were certain times when I'd see pictures of myself or her, and for a moment didn't know who was who!"

hen it comes to making a grand entrance, Chris Hardwick knows how to pull it off. The warmhearted comedian who hosts *Talking Dead* and *The Wall* made quite an introduction last year as he took the stage in New York's Rockefeller Plaza for NBC's live Red Nose Day event.

"The stage last year had this material that looks really great on camera but is really deadly slippery if it gets even kind of moist – this material was like a Slip 'N Slide. So, of course, it was raining all day," Hardwick explains. "People were going down left and right, and I was very pleased with myself that during rehearsal, I was able to stay on my feet. And then we start the live broadcast, and they go, 'OK, go,' and I take two steps out onto this surface and my feet are just up in the air before I know what's happening. I fell right on my ass, which was great because it wasn't an intended pratfall, but it was just a great way to start off the special. It was one of those accidental in-the-moment things, and it sort of started off with 'Well, you can't take yourself too seriously."

And Red Nose Day is actually a balance of just that – it's celebrities coming together for an evening of laughter and serious fundraising with a global goal of ending child poverty. The event was started in the U.K. in 1988 by Comic Relief and has since raised over \$1 billion globally in its 30-year history. Since its launch in the U.S. in 2015, the event has raised over \$100 million – \$40 million last year alone – where proceeds have positively impacted the lives of more than 8.3 million children living in the States and internationally.

This year's event will air on NBC Thursday, May 24, and will again feature Hardwick at the helm along with a mix of celebrities and educational segments on children and communities in need.

"I don't think a lot of people really know how bad it is," Hardwick says. "I think most people have a vague idea that, you know, there are hungry children in the world, there are children who need care. They don't necessarily put a face to it, or they don't necessarily think about it in very clear terms. I think that's why it's so important that we do specials like this to remind people — to be able to put faces on it so that people really do understand and they can empathize and see this is real. This is a real problem, and this is something that's not gonna go away unless we do something about it."

For a guy who wears his emotions on his sleeve – he's frequently tearyeyed just listening to his *Wall* contestants share their hardships and a bit of a hot mess when it comes to *Walking Dead* major casualties (like who isn't, right?) – Hardwick couldn't be more genuine in trying to do his part to make a difference.

"They do such a great job putting the show together, and so many people jump onboard and want to play around, so the special itself has a really nice range of emotions. It's really fun, and it doesn't take itself too seriously, but then obviously, it can be very touching and dramatic and beautiful, and so it's just a great thing to be involved with," Hardwick says. "This is not a political issue. It's a human issue. Anytime a child is hungry or feels unloved or is not taken care of, that's a crime against nature. One of the things that [celebrities] can do with the gift that we're given by having these megaphones is to help build awareness for things that people should be aware of and be paying attention to. I can't think of many causes that are as universal and as pressing as children."

# **HBO Reboots The Fiery Ray Bradbury Classic For A Digital**

World. By Lori Acken

Depending on your perspective, making a contemporary film adaptation of Ray Bradbury's bookburning classic Fahrenheit 451 in the era of Snapchat and Twitter, "fake news," handheld devices and monster flat screens is either brilliance or insanity.

No one understands that better than Ramin Bahrani, who directs HBO's update of the cautionary tale. "I knew that once I got into it, there would be no way that I wouldn't upset somebody who loved Bradbury's work," says Bahrani. "So, I tried to stay true to the themes. Even if I changed certain characters or plotlines [and he did so liberally], I wanted the themes to be there, to take them and modernize them. It wasn't easy. At one point I asked my agent to call HBO and say I wanted to give them their money back."

Bradbury's futuristic thriller depicted a world in which TV was king and books weren't just banned but burned (yes, at precisely 451 degrees) by celebrated "firemen" in an attempt to homogenize and neutralize human thought and, thus, humanity. While reminding us of Bradbury's foresight, Bahrani takes it a step further, keeping Bradbury's firemen and book-loving rebels, but placing them in a no-longer-far-off time in which

an Alexa-like robo-butler called Yuxie rules everyone's roost and "news" is delivered in sensationalized bytes and bits on the sides of buildings, where consumers can "like" and "comment" on an ultra-grand scale. Get caught with a book, and not only will your stash be burned, but your very identity commandeered.

Only after an elderly reader opts to burn with her books does zealous fireman Montag (Black Panther's Michael B. Jordan, who also executive produces) start to question the motives of his commander and mentor Beatty (Michael Shannon, whose sharply carved features make him a dandy futuristic villain). And when Montag falls for a comely young blonde named Clarisse (Sofia Boutella), who informs for Beatty to cover for a group that preserves books by memorizing them, he fully understands how much he has both contributed to and sacrificed for an insidious and dehumanizing cause.

"That goes to one of the things in Bradbury's novel that's different from the Orwell classic 1984," Bahrani offers. "Bradbury says, 'We asked for this,' which is a line that Clarisse gives Montag. ... We've handed [control] over to Google, Facebook, the government. Hopefully a new generation is going to start to have a different opinion and, I hope, bring back what we're willingly giving up."

# PBS Charms With A Star-Packed Homage To The Louisa May Alcott

Yes, Little Women - Louisa May Alcott's 1868 paean to family and femininity in all of its forms - is a natural for PBS' Masterpiece anthology. But its aptness at a time when basic human graces like honor, civility, compassion and loyalty are at a premium is inarquable. Consider a passage in the letter Mr. March - serving as a chaplain in the Civil War - pens to his daughters in the miniseries' earliest moments: "Our country may be torn in two because it cannot agree on what is right, but even in this time of darkness ... we can shine a light through our kindness to each other. There are smaller battles we can win within our hearts and close to home."

But there's another side to this gorgeous show, too - one that makes you want to cast off your handheld devices, forget Facebook (or that extra hour or two in the office) and throw yourself headlong into life, warts and all, to remember what it is like to truly feel. Created by a who's who of British-drama excellence, this Little Women is a blend of tested and fresh talent

that breathes new life into Alcott's work without a single unwelcome whiff of modernization. Revered actors -Dylan Baker as Mr. March; Emily Watson, delicious as a fully realized Marmee; Angela Lansbury wrapping affection in sandpaper as Aunt March; and Harry Potter vet Michael Gambon as Mr. Laurence - play the elders. But it's the quartet of young actresses playing the beloved March sisters that steals the show, particularly Maya Hawke - the sparkplug daughter of Uma Thurman and Ethan Hawke - who, in her very first acting role, is a revelation as Jo.

Screenwriter Heidi Thomas (Call the Midwife) claims her own epiphany came in realizing that "I no longer stand in the shoes of any of the sisters, but in Marmee's," and that Alcott actually gave the saintly character nuances she and Watson could sink their teeth into. "Heidi allowed us to see behind that strong, reliable, good mom and see her struggle," says Watson. "[Marmee's] learned to work out what's useful, good anger in the current moment and what is anger from the past. ... I felt that was really inspiring. Because the last time I looked, I was Jo."

# SWEETBITTER

# Stephanie Danler's Coming-Of-Age Book Is Now A Feast-For-The-Senses Series. By Lori Acken

Like a well curated menu, Starz's new dramedy *Sweetbitter* has something scrumptious for all tastes. Foodies and wine lovers will swoon over luscious images and discussions of eat and drink. The brave legions that serve us when we dine out finally have a restaurant show that honors them. Scenesters get the kind of New York that only New Yorkers know. And everyone can painlessly relive our own brink-of-adulthood reckoning via the show's 22-year-old heroine Tess, winningly played by *Churchill*'s Ella Purnell.

Tess – the alter ego of Sweetbitter screenwriter Stephanie Danler, who also penned the bestseller on which the show is based – is a restless Midwesterner with a fruitless English degree and the sort of "anywhere but here" momentum that lands her, driftless and penniless, in New York City. Her moxie catches the attention of an enigmatic restaurant owner whose sink-or-swim offer to learn the trade lands her

under the tutelage of an eclectic group of coworkers at his high-end eatery. For Purnell, the role proved a deliciously eerie twist of fate. "I was in a weird place in my career and in my life, and was going to take some time off to re-figure out who I was and what I wanted to do," the 21-year-old Londoner says. "I'm so protective of Tess, because I feel like she is me and I am her."

Danler – who knew firsthand that pairing a young woman's personal evolution with the evolution of her palate makes a potent mix – realized Purnell's perfection before she even said a word. "In a show where so much is going to be about observation, you want eyes that reflect the world," Danler says of her star's enormous peepers. "I saw her eyes and was like, 'Oh God, *please* be able to act.""

Purnell could. And she aced the tastier hazards of the job,

as well. Purnell recalls an early scene in which Tess experiences oysters – and the evocative power of taste – for the very first time. "I can't eat fish, so it was a whole palaver and, in the end, I was like, 'I'll have *one*,'" Purnell says. "They did this big close-up, and I ate an oyster [because] I wanted to feel how that felt. Suddenly all the words that were in the script that described salt, described the ocean – the sensory thing was *so* present."

For Danler, the chance to show restaurant work as a complex and meaningful career meant that sets were meticulously plotted and actors trained with her former colleagues at Union Square Café. "I was in the industry for 16 years, so it's deeply personal to me that it is authentic," Danler says. "I feel this great responsibility to everyone I've ever worked with to not over-romanticize it and to not make it into a joke."

# Nothing's Coming Up Roses For Benedict Cumberbatch's Patrick

Melrose. By Jacqueline Cutler

You know *Patrick Melrose* is bound to be a complicated, compelling story when its opening scene where the lead character's father dies is a day brightener.

Benedict Cumberbatch stars in and executive produces Showtime's limited series based on Edward St. Aubyn's semiautobiographical books. For a literate actor, nothing could be better. Cumberbatch longed to play the arch, incisive Melrose since reading the books, which chronicle a reprehensible father and a delusional mother. Patrick is a "really unique character who suffers so much and goes on this extraordinary journey from victimhood to survivor," Cumberbatch says.

Spanning decades and told in five separate episodes, Patrick Melrose also stars Jennifer Jason Leigh, Hugo Weaving, Allison Williams, Blythe Danner and Anna Madeley. The second episode, set in the south of France in 1967, features a harrowing revelation that explains much about Patrick.

It's an unflinching look at monsters behind perfect manners.

"And not just cash-poor landed gentry, but just the inherent snobbery, the treachery, the self-loathing, the cynicism, the patronizing attitudes," Cumberbatch says, adding that "they were exposed and rightly vilified in the most humorous, entertaining, and at times terrifyingly dark and real ways."

The pilot, set in 1982, has Patrick leaving London for Manhattan to collect his father's ashes. It's a testament to his body's endurance that it can withstand that much heroin, cocaine, pills and a massive mix of booze.


This, though, is truly a testament to Cumberbatch's talent. Using his lanky frame to depict the ravages of drugs, he also radiates a deeply interior performance.

# HBO Bows Jennifer Fox's Sundance-Lauded Account Of Abuse And Resilience. By Lori Acken

or more than three decades, filmmaker Jennifer Fox thought she was lucky. That, as a smart, independent 13-year-old in the freewheeling '70s, it was pure sophistication that her first "boyfriend" – the fellow who took her virginity – was an older man who found her beautiful and exceptionally gifted. Still prepubescent, Fox memorialized the "relationship" in "The Tale," an English class story about the man, their introduction via the elegant riding instructor she called Mrs. G and the trio's "magical" summer spent defying the conventions of love and freedom.

Fox called it a work of fiction. It wasn't. The man she labeled "Bill" was 40. Her track coach. And Fox wasn't lucky. She was abused.

Decades later, while making a documentary about female sexuality around the globe, a stunned Fox discovered that over half of the women she interviewed matter-of-factly recounted abuse in their sexual history. Warning bells sounded faintly in her head. Then her horrified mother unearthed and sent her "The Tale." "It was a big shock for me to realize that something I called a relationship actually fell into the paradigm of child sexual abuse," Fox admits. With her mom as her sounding board, Fox met with the major players under the guise of old times' sake, scrambling home afterward to preserve conversations and impressions. And *The Tale* was reborn as her most important film to date, a complex and powerful recounting of stealth abuse and shocking denial that serves as a warning shot about the prevalence of child exploitation and how abusers — who, Fox notes, "never look like abusers, ever" — sway their victims and those around them.

As Bill and Mrs. G, Jason Ritter and Elizabeth Debicki lend chilling humanity to people who cannot or will not see their crime, while Emmy winner Laura Dern and a preteen Isabelle Nélisse – whose part in heartbreaking intimate scenes was filmed solo in a wholly nonsexual manner – each employ a rending blend of pain and pride as the older and younger Jennifers. "The whole script is trying to investigate why and how this happened, who Bill was and who Mrs. G was," Fox offers. "And how are we still missing cues? I hope, in total, the film helps both sides of the equation."

Created by Devious Maids scribe Tanya Saracho to reflect her own life and lineage, Vida is a gutsy dramedy about estranged Los Angeles sisters whose homecoming forces them to confront myriad truths about their mom, their past and their own self-images as Americans of Mexican heritage. "They chose two very different paths to get out of their neighborhood," explains Melissa Barrera, who plays the ultragirlie Lyn. "Sadly, like many women do when they're young and get told that they're pretty and that's all the compliments they ever get ... she decided that was the only thing that she had. She's living off of men, and that does not sit well with Emma."

"Emma was sent away very young," adds Mishel Prada, who plays the worldlier sibling. "She realized early that if she didn't take care of herself, nobody else would. She pulled herself up by her bootstraps and made something of herself, but never really dealt with the emotional part of it."

And while the sisters may just discover their former home is still where the heart is, don't expect the journey to come with a Jane the Virgin sheen. "We're trying to really portray these complicated Latina millennials, because oftentimes we [are] the archetype," says Saracho. "To really scratch up the image of these girls is important to us — because I think that's real."





on't expect a sophomore slump for History's *SIX* when it returns on Memorial Day. The action drama following an elite team of Navy SEALs is back with a vengeance for Season 2.

The first eight episodes followed the SEALs on a mission to rescue their friend and former team leader Rip Taggart (Walton Goggins) and a group of schoolgirls taken hostage by a terrorist cell in West Africa. While the mission was a success, the homecoming was bittersweet for SEAL Team leader Joe "Bear" Graves (Barry Sloane), who returned to an empty house. It was much worse for Rip, who had a shocking seaside encounter with a terrorist recruit in the season's closing scene.

"The story picks up right where it left off," Sloane assures us. "There's no time gap. There's no shift. We pick it up right from the pier."

While Rip's fate hangs in the balance, the SEALs have to face the frightening reality that the war has come home with them. They're left to wonder how many homegrown terrorists are operating in this sleeper cell, who's coordinating them and which of the SEALs – or their family members – will be targeted next. "[SEALs] do work very hard to keep their family away from the battlefield," Sloane says. "When it's on your own doorstep, it's hard to dissociate that part of your life."

The mission to counter this new threat sends the SEALs to Eastern Europe and hostile areas like Chechnya to strike at the heart of the terrorist network. This brings them dangerously close to Russian territory, where their actions could have serious geopolitical consequences and spark a much bigger conflict.

Enter CIA officer Gina Cline, played by series newcomer Olivia Munn (*The Newsroom*). Cline is calling the SEALs' shots for this new mission, and some operators are better at taking orders than others. "You get to see during this season the SEALs' position in the pecking order of the United States, and it's not as high as you would initially think," Sloane says. "These guys don't get the ultimate say in pretty much anything."

Sloane likens Munn's role to Jessica Chastain's character in the film *Zero Dark Thirty*. "They are incredibly smart, incredibly driven professionals, who in order to achieve what they would like to achieve, they're not shy about reaching out to people with a different skill set from their own to get the job done," he says.

For Sloane and his castmates, getting this job done required skills beyond the brutal but basic SEAL training they received for Season 1. "This season we were treated more like operators, which was great," Sloane says. "We

were given a huge rucksack to fill with various torture implements, and taken off into the mountains of British Columbia with two Navy SEALs. We arrived and started walking, and didn't stop walking for four days. We learned how to survive in subzero conditions in the snow, how to plot our course without conventional GPS location."

It's all worth it to give the 10-episode second season a bigger scale, heightened emotion, greater danger and more intense action.

"When you're working on a medical drama, the chances of doing a musical, or even just being able to sing or dance or do any of that, are very slim to none," Kodjoe laughs, giving huge praise to Seitzman for continuously pushing the edge in the writers room. "The way he packaged it and told a story was just absolutely genius. So we were super hyped about getting started. And this was a serious undertaking. There's 13 cast members and we had a choreographer who was working really, really hard to support us in our strengths and not expose our weaknesses."





The roar of the engines. The exhaust fumes. So many left turns. You've got to love the sights, sounds and smells of spring when you're a race fan! Here's a May preview of the top auto racing series:

Verizon IndyCar Series The hallowed ground of the Brickyard hosts the INDYCAR Grand Prix on Indianapolis Motor Speedway's combined road course May 12 on ABC. Qualifying for the Indianapolis 500 takes place May 19-20 on ABC, and the Memorial Day weekend tradition returns for the 102nd Indianapolis 500 May 27 on ABC. Former IndyCar and NASCAR driver Danica Patrick calls it a career after racing the No. 13 GoDaddy Chevy for Ed Carpenter Racing at the Indy 500. It's also the last Indy 500 broadcast for ABC, which will air the race for the 54th straight year and then hand off IndyCar broadcast rights to NBC beginning in 2019.

Formula One The F1 series spends the month in Western Europe as rivals Lewis Hamilton and Sebastian Vettel each continue their quest for a fifth season championship. Up first is the Spanish Grand Prix in Barcelona May 13 on ESPN2. Then F1's most prestigious and scenic race returns to the streets of Monte Carlo on May 27 for the Monaco Grand Prix. ESPN airs the race live, with ABC airing an encore in the afternoon.

#### **Monster Energy NASCAR Cup Series**
