Inside the spooky spot, Vincent and Victoria embark on "an unexpected, magical adventure of personal discovery, culminating in a spectacular dance finale featuring an animated Michael Jackson." With Jackson's music as its soundtrack, along with the voices of Christine Baranski, Alan Cumming, George Eads, Brad Garrett, Lucy Liu and Jim Parsons, *Michael Jackson's Halloween* is a treat.

HORROR AT THE CECIL HOTEL



In the 1920s, L.A.'s Cecil Hotel was a glamorous art deco destination. But that was short-lived as, after the Great Depression hit, it turned into a seedy, low-budget hotel with a salacious guest book and notorious dark past that included murders, suicides and serial killers. The sinister happenings at the hotel actually served as the inspiration behind American Horror Story: Hotel. Investigation Discovery's three-part docuseries Horror at the Cecil Hotel (beginning Oct. 16) follows some of the creepiest unexplained stories that occurred there. One of the cases is that of Elisa Lam, who disappeared on Jan. 31, 2013, and was later found dead in the hotel's rooftop water tank. The series features actual video surveillance that shows Lam bizarrely hiding in the elevator and talking mysteriously with her

hands to what could be an evil presence. Additional episodes explore whether there is an underlying evil that connects the grisly events that plagued this hotel.

You'll Never Stay Home Alone Again

You know how you keep your blinds open at night thinking no one can really see you? You think because it's a small town, you don't need to lock your doors? Yeah, you are going to rethink that one. Investigation Discovery's new series *Home Alone* (Thursdays beginning Oct. 12) shares horrifying true stories about late-night break-ins, stalkers and home invasions that will leave you jumping at any little noise in your house.

Why Was A Small Town In Ohio Evacuated In 1974?

Destination America's two-hour special Helltown revisits a real-life event that has spawned decades of questions and conspiracy theories. In 1974 the town of Boston, Ohio, which is located in the northern part of Summit County, was abruptly evacuated by the government and pretty much erased off the map. Homes and businesses were eerily abandoned, and signs posted warned that the land was "closed to public use and travel because of emergency conditions." Helltown (Oct. 31) will investigate the real story.





Stay Out Of Those Woods

Although fictional, 1999's horror/mystery *The Blair Witch Project* left us permanently scarred and forever afraid of venturing into the woods at night. Destination America capitalizes on that innate fear in the new series *Terror in the Woods* (Tuesdays beginning Oct. 10). The series shares real-life stories from people who went into the woods, only to be scared out by ghosts, monsters and other unexplained phenomena.

Tim Roth Talks About His "Anarchic" New Amazon Revenge Drama. By Jeff Pfeiffer

"It's very anarchic in its structure," Tim Roth told us in a recent interview about his new drama series *Tin Star*, which was produced for Sky Atlantic in Europe and will air on Amazon here in the States beginning Sept. 29. "[My] character is [anarchic], too," the actor added, talking about his starring role as Jim Worth, a British former detective who moves his family to a small town in the Canadian Rockies, where he takes on the job of police chief. "There is a Jekyll-and-Hyde element to it, as well."

That element stems from what we learn of Jim's past as an alcoholic who is two years sober when we meet him. When an oil refinery fronted by corporate liaison Elizabeth Bradshaw (Christina Hendricks) opens in the town, a series of tragic events edges him toward becoming his former alcoholic persona, "Jack," a man infinitely more menacing and unpredictable than family man Jim.

And as sinister elements from Jim's past resurface, and we learn more about that past in a slow burn over the first few of the series' 10 episodes, audiences may find themselves rooting for him to revert to "Jack" to get his revenge.

"Once you find out what Jim really is," Roth agreed, "and then, as a consequence, what he's capable of, it gives other [story] options, as well. So, it kicks in. It's fun. It's really, really fun. ... It's a fun character to play."

hat do you get when you pair up two of entertainment's funniest guys, then add some genuine scares, a buddy-flick sensibility and monster-of-the-week fun? The perfect comedy to usher in the Halloween season.

Ghosted follows the misadventures of Leroy (Craig Robinson, *The Office*), an ousted cop turned security guard, and struggling paranormal author Max (Adam Scott, *Parks and Recreation*), who is certain his wife was abducted by aliens. Recruited by a kooky secret bureau led by nononsense Capt. Lafrey (Ally Walker) to track down the missing agent who handpicked the unlikely duo to save him, Leroy and Max embark on a mission that may venture into the supernatural – though Leroy doesn't believe that for a minute. "[Max] was a professor in astrophysics at Stanford and started writing papers on the multiverse and his belief in the paranormal and aliens – and he became a laughingstock," says Scott. "But he still has this optimism to him. In the series, Max is slowly on his way to redemption, professionally We Can't Quit Craig Robinson And Adam Scott's Supernatural Laugher. By Lori Acken

and personally. Same with Craig's character. We meet these guys at the bottom and see how they are clawing their way back, through the bureau."

And take note, sci-fi fans: *Ghosted* writer/executive producer Kevin Etten says the series won't sacrifice spooky for the sake of a laugh. "We ended up cutting a few jokes to preserve the tension and to keep it a little more grounded and real, because we felt like the laughs would end up bigger if you keep it really tense – and then there's that release."

Walker – a Sons of Anarchy and Longmire alum – flexes impressive comic muscle in a power-suited character Etten likens to master motivator/manipulators like Steve Jobs or former Lakers coach Phil Jackson. "She's a mom," a grinning Walker retorts. Though only Robinson will cop to a personal ghostly experience – and he *really* doesn't want to talk about it – creator Tom Gormican jokes that the one time he thought his own house was haunted, "it turned out to be a home invasion." Of the *not*-paranormal kind.

Best known for hilarious turns in cutting-edge laughers like *Strangers With Candy* and *Unbreakable Kimmy Schmidt*, Amy Sedaris is also proudly devoted to all things domestic, an obsession she's chronicled in signature Sedaris fashion in the comic tomes *I Like You: Hospitality Under the Influence* and *Simple Times: Crafts for Poor People.*

At Home is a combo of both books' kooky-meets-useful(ish) content and an homage to Sedaris' favorite childhood show, a local-access bit of pablum called At Home With Peggy Mann. Operating on a set modeled after and peppered with stuff from her own home, Sedaris says, "On my show, stuff looks like I made it. A lot of people can't do what Martha Stewart does. Martha can't even do what Martha does!" Sedaris adds that her hardest work went into crafting the perfect blend of public-TV banality and late-night cable laughs. "What's the painter's name – Bob Ross!" she exclaims. "We watched an episode and just felt drugged afterwards. I said, '*This* is the feeling I want when people watch the show!' That was our biggest challenge for this: How do you transfer that feeling from watching Bob Ross to laughing to really learning something? It'll be interesting to see if we pulled it off."

"I don't really miss things, people that much. But I was missing it, and I was missing these idiots," David says, referring to his costars. "So I thought, 'Yeah, what the hell?' And I got tired of people asking me, 'Is the show coming back?' I couldn't face that question anymore, and I wasn't ready to say, 'No, never.' And I kept saying, 'Oh, you know, maybe. Who knows?' So I thought, 'Yeah, I won't have to be asked that anymore.'"

As recent history demonstrates, qualifications are way overrated when it comes to winning an election.

In ABC's *The Mayor*, young aspiring rapper Courtney (Brandon Micheal Hall) sees running for mayor of his fictional San Francisco Bay Area town as the perfect publicity stunt to boost his music career. To his shock, Courtney wins the election and has to figure out how to handle the weight of the office's responsibilities. Fortunately, he has help from his mom (*Community*'s Yvette Nicole Brown), his adviser (*Glee*'s Lea Michele), and his high-school buddies T.K. (Marcel Spears) and Jermaine (Bernard David Jones).

Courtney has swagger and a way with words, but he's also got a genuine love and concern for his community, and he realizes his potential for doing good. "He's this fish out of water who looks around in his community, sees these problems," series creator Jeremy Bronson says. "He's been rapping about them and writing about them for years, and now he's in a position to actually effect some change."

KEVIN (PROBABLY) SAVES THE WORLD

Jason Ritter displays the same warmth and comic timing of his father, the late John Ritter

Jason Ritter Can Save Us All With Humanity, Hope And Heart. By Kellie Freeze

When Kevin Finn (Jason Ritter) loses everything, the 30-something returns home to his family's picturesque farm to live with his recently widowed twin sister (JoAnna Garcia Swisher) and her mourning teen daughter (Chloe East). But once home, he is divinely informed that he is one of humanity's remaining "righteous souls" and is tasked with finding the others, enlisting them as an army for good and – essentially – saving the world. This is the suspend-all-disbelief premise of ABC's charming new drama *Kevin (Probably) Saves the World*.

At first glance, Kevin's flaws make him a candidate for *least* likely to save humanity: He's selfish, self-centered and, depending on the religion, his recent suicide attempt probably won't win him favor with God, either. But, Ritter says, "No one is a lost cause. There's an opportunity for redemption for everybody."

The series tackles heavy topics like death and grief, but it is also laugh-out-loud funny. In the pilot, Kevin imprudently touches a recently landed asteroid and is blown head-overheels from the impact crater. The cartoonish flight is an unexpected jolt in the middle of a life-pondering moment. "Some of the hardest times I've laughed have been in the darkest times of my life," reveals Ritter. "There's always a roiling mix of light and dark." And if humanity needs saving, Ritter as his lovably imperfect Kevin is (probably) the perfect man for the job.

"And handin-hand with the mystery of this character is the mystery of what happens to her daughter – and why, and the who."

Flint residents who won't take its water woes sitting down

> I remember a time when we thought the government would **take care of the people**. They don't anymore. **We have to speak up**.

> > all? For some residents of Flint, Mich. – a downtrodden city an hour north of Detroit that once boasted General Motors' largest plant – what filled their tubs and tumblers became a matter of economics.

And then life and death.

In 2014, state officials gave the go-ahead to use the notoriously polluted Flint River as the city's temporary water source, a cost-saving measure intended as a two-year stopgap during construction of a new pipeline connecting Flint with Lake Huron. Within months, residents suffered a host of maladies. from rashes and hair loss to serious deterioration of organs and cognition - all related to shocking levels of lead and other contaminants flowing into their homes each day. As the government scrambled to guietly mitigate the growing crisis, alarmed locals realized only they could save themselves.

Spurred by Josh Sanburn's searing *Time* magazine cover story "The Toxic Tap," producers Neil Meron and Craig Zadan teamed with Cher, Queen Latifah and Katie Couric to bring the crisis, coverup and remarkable everyday heroes to television in the Lifetime original movie *Flint*. Rather than belabor mortifying details of how water corrosive enough to destroy car parts was passed off as drinkable, the film focuses on real-life local moms LeeAnne Walters (Betsy Brandt) and Melissa Mays (Marin Ireland), who joined forces with activist Nayyirah Shariff (Jill Scott) to expose the wrongdoings, even as their own health declined.

"Melissa didn't know anything about plumbing or corrosion," Ireland exclaims of former DJ Mays, who consulted on the film. "That's *all* she spends her day doing now, talking about it and educating everybody. She was exhibiting symptoms before she even noticed it in her kids and her husband, because – and this is

SPIELBERG ON THE SMALL SCREEN By Jeff Pfeiffer

On Oct. 7, HBO debuts its excellent new documentary *Spielberg*, about the life and work of iconic filmmaker Steven Spielberg. The film delves into not only the feature-film work for which he is most famed, but also his work in television – spotlighting his early years spent directing TV episodes and films, and the evolution of his production company Amblin Entertainment. Here's are a few of Spielberg's small-screen highlights over the years:



debut with "Eyes," the second of three segments in this TV movie that served as a pilot for Rod Serling's anthology series. As if that wouldn't make a young director nervous enough, Spielberg was tasked with directing screen legend Joan Crawford in one of her final onscreen roles.

DUEL (1971)

In his full-length film directing debut, Spielberg shunned the TV "movie of

the week" formula and created a white-knuckle thriller that was so brilliantly executed it was released theatrically in Europe.



Spielberg created, helped develop and directed a few episodes, including the pilot, of this NBC sci-fi/ fantasy anthology series. so heartbreaking – she had just started working with a trainer, trying to get in really good shape and take care of herself. So, she was drinking *gallons* of that water."

For Brandt, a proud Michigan native who keeps a "Recall Governor Rick Snyder" button in her car, the story feels especially personal, since the crisis and its fallout is ongoing, even as public outcry wanes. "I just got into a fight about Flint water with my husband – who's a smart, good guy!" she grins. "I was like, '*Really.* I want to understand what you think. If I take that water that you *know* has lead in it and I run it through a Brita [water filter], you're gonna drink it and think that's fine?' He's like, 'Well, maybe those filters help.' I was like, 'They *don't*!'"

And, all agree, neither do elected officials who put thriving careers before thriving constituents.

"I remember a time when we thought the government would take care of the people," Meron laments. "They don't anymore. We *have to* speak up. That's the essence of the movie, because taxpayers' money is not to take care of the taxpayers. It's to take care of somebody else's pocketbooks. ... Melissa just told me she had a seizure last week. Her kids don't have summers anymore because they're all in rehab trying to reclaim their lives. *This* is their life."

The WATCHER IN THE WOODS Melissa Joan Hart Puts A Modern Spin On The Vintage Disney Thriller. By Lori Acken

Melissa Joan Hart and her business partner/mom Paula spent years trying to score rights to the 1980 thriller *The Watcher in the Woods*, Disney Studios' first foray into the horror genre, and an obsession for Melissa and her siblings when they were kids. The PG-rated spectacle told the tale of Mrs. Aylwood, whose little daughter Karen vanished decades before under ominous circumstances. When teenage Jan and her family rent Aylwood manor for the summer, she and her little sister Ellie become dangerously entangled in the mystery.

"By the time we got the rights, I was too old to play Jan and too young to play Mrs. Aylwood," Hart laughs. "So, I wanted to direct it." Hart and screenwriter Scott Abbott opted to refresh the tale for a new generation, holding on to "three very special moments from the original movie," she says. "I went back and watched it, just to make sure I didn't miss anything that was iconic. Those moments are there for fans that loved it as children (*Nerak*!) – but it's a very updated version. We really made it our own."

Hart relished having Oscar winner Anjelica Huston as her Mrs. Aylwood – a role originated by Bette Davis. "Most of the time I was just thinking, 'She knows more than I do!" Hart smiles. "Her father was a director, she's directed – just knowing that it's Anjelica Huston, you just let her be Anjelica Huston."

Iconic X-Men Heroes Are

Part Of New FOX Drama. By John Russell

nd you thought your family had drama. In FOX's new sci-fi thriller The Gifted, a seemingly ordinary clan of four, the Struckers, find themselves caught up in the saga of persecuted mutants that began 17 years ago with the first X-Men film. And director Bryan Singer, who's helmed multiple X-Men blockbusters, is part of the team helping to bring the iconic heroes to TV.

Just don't call The Gifted an "X-Men show," says executive producer Matt Nix (Burn Notice). "The X-Men are gone, and nobody knows where they went," Nix explains of the series. "What's left behind are groups of mutants that are piecemeal, doing what they can to help [fellow mutants] on the wrong side of the law get to safety." The Struckers fall in with these

renegades after bullied teen son Andy (Percy Hynes White) develops destructive powers that go nuclear at a school dance - think Carrie with more rubble and less pig blood. The debacle forces him and gifted big sister Lauren (Natalie Alyn Lind), who can move objects with her mind, to come out as mutants to parents Reed (Stephen Moyer) and Caitlin (Amy Acker).

To escape the government's virulently antimutant laws - which would allow for agents to take Andy into custody after he used his powers - the family turns to the underground network of outlaw mutants for help. And yes, there's a twist: Reed just happens to prosecute mutants, as he works for a Texas district attorney's office.

The government agents who are trying to capture the Struckers won't

be portrayed as "mustache-twisting villains," says Nix. Reed in particular exists in a gray area, at least initially. "[Working for the DA], he thinks he's doing the right thing," Moyer says. "He's taking [dangerous] mutants off the street. It isn't until he sees how badly some of them have been treated - and he kind of knew, he'd just chosen not to see it - that he realizes he has to take his children and run."

How will The Gifted intersect with the X-Men films? The series will take advantage of the concept of parallel timelines, introduced in the 2014 film Days of Future Past - and baked into the comic's lore since the 1980s. Says Nix, "That allows us to be in a different universe, but not separate in ways that other film franchises may be from their TV shows."

THE STORY OF US With Morgan Freeman

Nat Geo Expands Freeman's "Story" Franchise From God To Man. By Lori Acken

Several years ago, Morgan Freeman and his producing partners Lori McCreary and James Younger traveled the globe to explore the uniting power of faith for National Geographic's smart and intensely moving *The Story of God With Morgan Freeman*, which bowed in 2016. Critically acclaimed and Emmy-nominated, the series debuted a shorter second season last January, even as the group was already at work on another approach to spotlighting global unity in a time where we can't even get along with our neighbors.

"Story of God felt so eye-opening to all of us," Younger explains. "Then we realized that religion is just one aspect of what keeps human society together. Love is a primal scaffolding in human society. Power and leadership – how people organize themselves into groups where they can be effective. That has been a constant. War and peace, same – a constant thing.

"[*The Story of Us*] is about bonds between people," Younger continues. "What do we agree to do *together*? What do we yearn for *together*? What do we struggle with each other about?" And equally important to understanding the concept of *us*, adds Freeman, "*Why* do we develop these bonds? And what if people *don't* bond?"



Thus, the "root of all evil" – money – necessarily enters the picture in several of the six *Story of Us* episodes. "Money does different things," Freeman muses. "If I've got enough of it, I have an awful lot of control over you and your life. *Awful* lot. And that's always caused rebellion. You've got all these have-nots starting to boil – and when that boils over, it's gonna force a leveling. I think that's in our future."

Still, Freeman calls the chance to explore the better part of human nature "life-assuring and self-assuring. Life is just a series of plateaus." He smiles. "If you keep reaching for the next one up, you're having a good time!"

Catching Criminals: There's An App For That. By Ryan A. Berenz

We've grown accustomed to crowdsourcing information like restaurant recommendations, movie reviews and real-time traffic tips, but could we someday use crowdsourcing to catch criminals?

That's the general premise of the new CBS techno-drama series *Wisdom of the Crowd.* Jeremy Piven (*Entourage*) plays Silicon Valley entrepreneur Jeffrey Tanner, who creates an app, Sophe, that mines publicly shared information that he believes will help find his daughter's murderer. Tanner's app revolutionizes detective work, but the new technology opens a Pandora's box of problems.

We may have to deal with those problems in the real world sooner than we think. *Wisdom of the Crowd* executive producer Ted Humphrey says there are already a

number of platforms like Sophe being developed. "We would be burying our heads in the sand to say this will never happen," Humphrev savs. "I think a better way to address it is to say what would be: What would be a way that this could happen where we could actually control it and try and use it for the greater good while acknowledging the potentially dark aspects of it?"

Lara Stolman's Insightful Film Spotlights Autism, Athleticism And The Power Of Hope. By Lori Acken

WHAT'S NEW

ichael "Mikey" McQuay Jr., Robert Justino and Kelvin Truong each have the lanky bodies and lean muscles that are hallmarks of champion swimmers. Star members of the Jersey Hammerheads swim team, the boys idolize Michael Phelps and Ryan Lochte, and are laser focused on the starting block and lightning fast in the water – earning medal upon medal in local, regional and statewide competitions near their New Jersey homes.

All three are also on the autism spectrum – a challenge that could make achieving their full athletic potential improbable. But these guys and their dozen-plus teammates have a pair of not-so-secret weapons: Mikey's dauntless parents Maria and Michael McQuay. The couple founded the Hammerheads in response to their son's affinity for water and lacking social and recreational opportunities in a community (and, frankly, a nation) that ignores the financial and emotional support special needs kids and their families desperately need.

Filmmaker Lara Stolman discovered the McQuays while seeking swim lessons for her own child, having learned that drowning is a leading cause of death for children on the autism spectrum, who are instinctively drawn to water. "Coach Mike said to me, 'This team is going to dominate the competition,'" Stolman marvels. "*Nobody* talks that way about children with autism and developmental disabilities. I was incredibly moved and inspired as a mom and as a filmmaker."

The result is the deeply affecting *Swim Team*, part of PBS' *POV* documentary series, which spotlights the individual challenges the McQuay, Justino and Truong families face as they navigate life in their homes, communities and school systems and celebrates the boys' exhilarating shared triumphs in the pool. "There's no pity when I coach these kids," Michael says. "I want them to feel like I want the best out of them, and I want the parents to see that they *can* do something. *Believe in your kid.* Give me a shot. Right now, we've got seven swimmers swimming for elite swim clubs, YMCAs, going to nationals!"

RETURNING FAVORITES



A s the zombie hit heads into its Season 8 premiere, which is also its 100th episode, *The Walking Dead* writer/executive producer Scott Gimple reflects, "The seven years I've been involved in it feel like just one breakneck season we've been working on the whole time. I look at this episode as the beginning of the next hundred episodes, which – and I don't mean to make such a brash and audacious statement – but story-wise, it does still feel like the beginning. [*Dead* creator] Robert Kirkman has certainly laid out a fascinating road map full of possibility, and we've seized upon those possibilities even more, exploring things even deeper." As Season 8 ushers in the comic series' much anticipated "All Out War" story arc following a thunderous Season 7 finale that revealed exactly who is the Grimes gang's friend and foe, Gimple shares intel on what's ahead.

Is The Entire Season "All Out War"?

Watching the first four episodes, [people] will be like, "See?!" But as we go into Episode 5, things shift and then start building up again – like taking a pot that's boiling off of the burner and putting it aside for a minute, then putting it on the burner again after adding some ingredients that will make it that much richer.

A More Nuanced Negan

That's a long-play story. Yes, we're going to begin to see what made Negan into Negan. We're gonna see things affect him in unusual ways. He is going to be a bit more of a nuanced character – but I will say, Lucille will still be in full effect. And he has some one-liners this season that are *devastating*.

Maggie As Leader

It's a huge season for Maggie. [Even though she's pregnant,]

I wouldn't look at her as a moral compass in any way. After the events of Episode 701, she was the first to say, even in her trauma, "We gotta round everybody up and figure out how we're gonna fight [The Saviors]" – with Rick being slow to roll on that. They all wound up in the same place by this season, but Maggie was there long before anyone else. She hates Negan. She hates the Saviors. And she's also a force to contend with. Maggie is, as far as the conflict goes, one of the more hawk-like voices that we'll hear. Can she fulfill the vengeance that she craves?

Rick And Michonne Making War, Not Love

The stakes are even higher for Michonne, in some ways. She pushed this whole thing forward. She was a big influence on Rick in getting back into this, and with that comes a sense of responsibility. And beyond that, being that much closer to Rick puts more weight on everything. If people thought that her warrior side was tempered by the relationship with Rick, that won't be the case this season!

The Wildcards Eugene And Dwight

The number one thing with Eugene – above loyalty, friendship, honor, anything – is survival. He lied his way into survival with Abraham and Rosita. So, it's not like a surprise. Negan offered him safety, and that's just too seductive. With Dwight, it's a different story. He wound up with Negan due to a very twisted emotional equation. ... He doesn't seem to really care about his own survival – he just wants to see things set right. He just wants to see the Saviors done. And yet they're both under the same roof. It's gonna create a very unusual kind of conflict.

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ONCE UPON A TIME

Can The Rebooted Fantasy Drama Live Happily Ever After Following Major Cast Departures? By Jeff Pfeiffer

hen the Season 6 finale of ABC's fantasy drama Once Upon a Time aired last May with an episode that could have doubled as a series finale, the show was on the bubble as to whether it would get a seventh season. Even before that finale aired, fans already knew that Jennifer Morrison (who played Emma), Ginnifer Goodwin (Snow White), Josh Dallas (Prince Charming), Emilie de Ravin (Belle), Rebecca Mader (Wicked Witch) and Jared Gilmore (young Henry) would not be back (though Morrison will appear in at least one episode to close out Emma's storyline). With such major changes, the question of if the show would return was accompanied by wondering how it might return.

The "if" was answered with a Season 7 renewal in May. As to "how" the show will look when it returns this month on a new night? Executive producers Edward Kitsis and David H. Goodman had answers.

"We thought of a six-year plan," said Kitsis. "Around Season 4 we started to realize that we wanted to start writing towards our own end point, and if the show was successful enough, or the network had interest enough to go on, that we would reboot it and creatively begin a new chapter."

That new chapter now has a



grownup Henry (played by Andrew J. West), who "has found himself in a new book, with new characters," Kitsis said.

Although Kitsis said that this season, Henry and Cinderella (Dania Ramirez) will "kind of be the epic romance that we had in Season 1 with Snow and Charming," producers aren't going to leave fans hanging regarding other happily-ever-afters.

"Episode 2 is going to answer what has happened with Emma and Captain Hook," he added, "and Episode 4 will answer that very question for Belle."

Season 3 of FOX's devilishly fun drama series Lucifer will be longer and include four stand-alone episodes that explore characters and events outside of the normal story arc. "It's given us the opportunity to play around with the show and what people think the format of the show is and explore different characters," star Tom Ellis says. 1 on Oct. 24 from the home park of the team with the better regularseason record. World Series Game 7, if necessary, is Nov. 1.
